Stall Cards

1a. The Rule

A stall card with all required information (specified below) must be posted on the stall or near the tie area whenever a mount is on competition grounds.

1b. Stall Cards Are Important

Stall cards provide quick access to information about your mount. Specific information is required, because it brings together information that may be important in an emergency situation, perhaps in the absence of the owner/agent or rider. This could save time, avoid confusion and may serve to assist a veterinarian in making a decision as to choice of treatments. For instance, this information may be useful in the following situations:

- The mount isn't feeling well. The baseline vital signs (TPR) listed on the stall card may help the vet evaluate the mount's condition and determine if treatment is needed.
- The night watch, noticing a mount is showing sings of discomfort, can quickly notify the rider and owner/agent using the contact information on the stall card.

1c. Making a Stall Card

You may copy and use this card or design your own. There is no specific way to design a stall card, but the stall card must:

- Have all the required information, and
- Be neat and organized, so it can be easily read.
